Command Line Arguments

Useful Classes in Java for IO

- File (<u>import java.io.File</u>)
 - allows you to open a file and do various file operations (e.g. check to see if it's a directory, hidden, etc, or rename it)
- Scanner (<u>import java.util.Scanner</u>)
 - o a text scanner that allows you parse text from various input sources such as a File or InputStream like stdin
- PrintWriter (<u>import java.io.PrintWriter</u>)
 - o allows you to print data more easily to various output sources such as a File or OutputStream like stdout

Hourglass

Hourglass

- Requires one command line argument
 - width of the hourglass
- Using recursion, print the hourglass shape to the console
- Printing both the top and bottom will be done in one method
- No additional methods are allowed

Argument Validation

You need to check the command line arguments in this order:

- If length of arguments is 0
- If length of arguments is greater than the required amount (1)
- Parse the width and make sure it is valid
 - o Must be odd and >= 1

Use the String constants that we have provided to print! See the write up for the specific messages that you need to print in each error case.

Aloha!

Say it as: Ah-loh-hah

Hawaiian words

Hawaiian words can be difficult to pronounce.

Humuhumunukunukuapua'a sounds like someone has fallen asleep on the keyboard.

The language is actually simple:

- 5 vowels
- 7 consonants



Vowels

Vowels		
a	sounds like ah. eg. Austin - ah-stin	
е	sounds like eh. eg. egg - eh-gg	
i	sounds like ee. eg. bee	
0	sounds like oh. eg. obey - oh bay	
u	sounds like oo. eg. mood - m oo d	

Vowels group

Vowel Groups		
ai	sounds like eye. eg. Ice	
ae	sounds like eye. eg. Ice	
ao	sounds like ow. eg. How	
au	sounds like ow. eg. How	
ei	sounds like ay. eg. Hay	
eu	sounds like eh-oh	
iu	sounds like ew. eg. Chew	
oi	sounds like oy. eg. Soy	
ou	sounds like ow. eg. How	
ui	sounds like ooey. eg Gooey	

Consonants

- w, p, k, h, 1, m, n
- Pronounced like the English versions.
